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**UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT**

*Ordered*, That when the Senate resumes consideration of the nomination on Thursday, March 12, 2009, there be 2 hours remaining for debate, equally divided and controlled between the Leaders or their designees; that upon the use of the time on Thursday, the Senate then proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination; that upon confirmation of the nomination, the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table, no further motions be in order, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate resume legislative session.

*(March 10, 11, 2009.)*

*Ordered*, That at 12 noon on Thursday, March 12, 2009, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of David W. Ogden, of Virginia, to be Deputy Attorney General, and that it be considered under the parameters of the order of March 10; 2009, that the vote on confirmation of the nomination occur at 2 p.m.

*Ordered further*, That upon confirmation of the Ogden nomination, the Senate then remain in executive session and consider the nomination of Thomas John Perrelli, of Virginia, to be Associate Attorney General; that debate on the nomination be limited to 90 minutes equally divided and controlled between the Leaders or their designees; that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination; that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table, no further motions be in order; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session.
