UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Kathleen Sebelius (Cal. No. 62)

Ordered, That at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, April 28, 2009, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Kathleen Sebelius, of Kansas, to be Secretary of Health and Human Services; that there be 8 hours of debate with respect to the nomination, with the time equally divided and controlled between the Leaders or their designees and that the Senator from Kentucky (Mr. Bunning) be allotted 20 minutes; that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination; and that confirmation be subject to an affirmative 60 vote threshold; that upon achieving that threshold, the nomination be confirmed and the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table; that no further motions be in order; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session.
