UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Roberto A. Lange (Cal. No. 469)

Ordered, That following Morning Business on Wednesday, October 21, 2009, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Roberto A. Lange, of South Dakota, to be United States District Judge for the District of South Dakota; that debate on the nomination be limited to 2 hours equally divided and controlled between the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy) and the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Sessions), or their designees; with the vote on confirmation occurring at 2 p.m.; that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table; no further motions be in order, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session.
