UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Jacqueline H. Nguyen (Cal. No. 487)

Ordered, That at 11:30 a.m., Tuesday, December 1, 2009, the Senate proceed to Executive Session to consider the nomination of Jacqueline H. Nguyen, of California, to be United States District Judge for the Central District of California; that debate with respect to the nomination be limited to 30 minutes, equally divided and controlled between the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy) and the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Sessions), or their designees; that at 12 noon, the Senate proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination; that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table; no further motions be in order; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session.
