Ordered, That on Wednesday, June 30, 2010, following morning business, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of General David H. Petraeus and that there be 20 minutes of debate with respect to the nomination, with the time equally divided and controlled between the Senator from Michigan (Mr. Levin) and the Senator from Arizona (Mr. McCain), or their designees; that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination, that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action, and the Senate resume legislative session.
