Ordered, That at 4:30 p.m. on Monday, February 14, 2011, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the following nominations: James E. Graves, Jr., of Mississippi, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Fifth Circuit, and Edward J. Davila, of California, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of California; provided further, that there be one hour for date equally divided in the usual form, that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote without intervening action or debate on the Graves and Davila nominations, in that order, that the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate, that no further motions be in order to any of the nominations, that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions and the Senate resume legislative session.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO OBJECT

When a notice of intent to object is given to the appropriate leader, or their designee, and such notice is submitted for inclusion in the Congressional Record and the Senate Executive Calendar, or following the objection to a unanimous consent to proceeding to, and, or disposition of, matters relating to nominations and treaties on their behalf, it shall be placed in the section of the Senate Executive Calendar entitled "Notice of Intent to Object". (S. Res. 28, 112th Congress)
