UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Loretta E. Lynch (Cal. No. 21)

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Thursday, April 23, 2015, notwithstanding Rule XXII, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of Loretta E. Lynch, of New York, to be Attorney General, and that there be 2 hours of debate, equally divided in the usual form, prior to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked, there be up to 2 hours of post-cloture debate equally divided between the two Leaders and that following the use or yielding back of that time, the Senate vote on the nomination.

Ordered further, That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Apr. 21, 22, 2015.*)
