UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Charles R. Breyer (Cal. No. 21)
Danny C. Reeves (Cal. No. 22)

Ordered, That following morning business on Tuesday, March 21, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session for the en bloc consideration of the nominations of Charles R. Breyer, of California, to be a Member of the United States Sentencing Commission for a term expiring October 31, 2021, and Danny C. Reeves, of Kentucky, to be a Member of the United States Sentencing Commission for a term expiring October 31, 2019.

Ordered further, That the time until 12 noon be equally divided, and that following the use or yielding back of time the Senate vote on the nominations en bloc with no intervening action or debate; that if confirmed, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table en bloc; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions, and that no further motions be in order.
