#### UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

#### Heather Wilson (Cal. No. 38) Scott Gottlieb (Cal. No. 53)

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Monday, May 8, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session for consideration of the nomination of Heather Wilson, of South Dakota, to be Secretary of the Air Force. Ordered further, That there be four hours of debate on the nomination equally divided in the usual

form, and that following the use or yielding back of time, the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination, and that if confirmed, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further*, That following disposition of the Wilson nomination on Monday, May 8, 2017, the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Scott Gottlieb, of Connecticut, to be Commissioner of Food and Drugs, Department of Health and Human Services.

Ordered further, That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of the Gottlieb nomination, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (May 3, 4, 2017.)
