UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Monday, October 2, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Ajit Varadaraj Pai, of Kansas, to be a Member of the Federal Communications Commission for a term of five years from July 1, 2016, with the time until 5:30 p.m. equally divided between the two Leaders or their designees.
