UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Michael Lawrence Brown (Cal. No. 389)
Walter David Counts III (Cal. No. 435)

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Thursday, January 11, 2018, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Michael Lawrence Brown, of Georgia, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of Georgia.

Ordered further, That at 12 noon, all post-cloture time on the Brown nomination be considered expired and the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination with no intervening action or debate.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Walter David Counts III, of Texas, to be United States District Judge for the Western District of Texas, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the Counts nomination, all post-cloture time be considered expired at 1:45 p.m., and the Senate vote on confirmation of the Counts nomination with no intervening action or debate.

Ordered further, That if confirmed, the motions to reconsider with respect to the Brown and Counts nominations be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Jan. 3, 10, 2018.*)
