#### UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

#### House Message to Accompany H. R. 302

Ordered, That notwithstanding Rule XXII, and as if in legislative session, at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, October 1, 2018, the Senate resume consideration of the House Message to accompany H. R. 302, an Act to provide protections for certain sports medicine professionals who provide certain medical services in a secondary State; provided that at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the motion to concur; provided further, that if cloture is invoked, the Senate remain in executive session and the post-cloture time continue to run as otherwise under the Rule; provided further, that upon the use or yielding back of post-cloture time, the Senate vote, as if in legislative session, on the motion to concur; provided further, that the mandatory quorum call under Rule XXII be waived. (Sept. 28, 2018.)
