Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Wednesday, September 23, 2020, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of John Charles Hinderaker, of Arizona, to be United States District Judge for the District of Arizona.

Ordered further, That at 11:45 a.m., notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the Hinderaker nomination.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked, the Senate vote on confirmation of the Hinderaker nomination at 4 p.m., and that following disposition of the nomination, the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Roderick C. Young, of Virginia, to be United States District Judge for the Eastern District of Virginia.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the Young nomination, the confirmation vote occur at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader on Thursday, September 24, 2020.

Ordered further, That the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination of Jocelyn Samuels, of Maryland, to be a Member of the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission for a term expiring July 1, 2021 following the cloture vote on the Young nomination.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the Hinderaker and Young nominations, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Sept. 17, 22, 2020.*)
