## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Wednesday, September 29, 2021, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Jessica Lewis, of Ohio, to be an Assistant Secretary of State (Political-Military Affairs).

*Ordered further*, That at 10:30 a.m. the Senate vote on confirmation of the Lewis nomination, with 1 hour of debate equally divided prior to the vote, and the Republican debate be controlled by the Senator from Texas (Mr. Cruz).

*Ordered further*, That upon disposition of the Lewis nomination, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of Robert T. Anderson, of Washington, to be Solicitor of the Department of the Interior.

*Ordered further*, That at 2:30 p.m., the cloture motions on the Anderson nomination and nomination of Jonathan Eugene Meyer, of Ohio, to be General Counsel, Department of Homeland Security ripen.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the Anderson and Meyer nominations, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That the cloture vote on the Meyer nomination occur immediately after the cloture vote on the Anderson nomination.

*Ordered further*, That if any of the nominations are confirmed on Wednesday, September 29, 2021, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Sept. 23, 28, 2021.*)
