#### UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

#### Mary T. Boyle (PN1542)

*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Thursday, May 12, 2022, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the motion to discharge the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation from further consideration of the nomination of Mary T. #### Jerome H. Powell (Cal. No. 807)

*Ordered*, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Republican Leader, notwithstanding Rule XXII, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Jerome H. Powell, of Maryland, to be Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System for a term of four years.

Ordered further, That there be 2 hours for debate, equally divided in the usual form on the nomination. Ordered further, That upon the use or yielding back of time the Senate vote without intervening action or debate on the nomination.

Ordered further, That if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions, and the Senate then resume legislative session. (May 10, 2022.)

#### Christopher Joseph Lowman (Cal. No. 777)

*Ordered*, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Republican Leader, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Christopher Joseph Lowman, of Virginia, to be an Assistant Secretary of Defense.

Ordered further, That the Senate vote on the nomination without intervening action or debate.

Ordered further, That if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table with no intervening action or debate; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions, and the Senate resume legislative session. (May 11, 2022.)
