## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

**Arianna J. Freeman (Cal. No. 1043) (PN1684)**

*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Tuesday, September 13, 2022, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Arianna J. Freeman, of Pennsylvania, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Third Circuit, post-cloture.

*Ordered further*, That at 11:30 a.m., all post-cloture time on the Freeman nomination be considered expired.

*Ordered further*, That following the cloture vote on the nomination of Lara E. Montecalvo, of Rhode Island, to be United States Circuit Judge for the First Circuit, the Senate recess until 2:15 p.m. to allow for the weekly caucus meetings.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the Montecalvo nomination, the mandatory quorum call required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That if any nominations are confirmed during Tuesday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Sep. 8, 12, 2022.*)
