*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Monday, September 19, 2022, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Florence Y. Pan, of the District of Columbia, to be United States Circuit Judge for the District of Columbia Circuit.

*Ordered further*, That the filing deadline for 1st degree amendments to the Amendment to Montreal Protocol ("Kigali Amendment") be at 4 p.m.

Ordered further, That at 5:30 p.m., the cloture motions on the Pan nomination and the Kigali Amendment ripen.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the nomination and the treaty, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived.

Ordered further, That if any nominations are confirmed during Monday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (Sep. 15, 2022.)

#### Cathy Ann Harris (Cal. No. 716) (PN1599)

Ordered, That cloture having been invoked on nomination of Cathy Ann Harris, of Maryland, to be Chairman of the Merit Systems Protection Board, all post-cloture time be considered expired, and the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, or his designee, following consultation with the Republican Leader.
