*Ordered further*, That at 11:30 a.m., notwithstanding Rule XXII, the Senate vote on confirmation of the Lund nomination.

*Ordered further*, That upon disposition of the Lund nomination, the cloture motion on the nomination of Kirk Edward Sherriff, of California, to be United States District Judge for the Eastern District of California ripen.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the nominations of Kirk Edward Sherriff, of California, to be United States District Judge for the Eastern District of California and Joshua Paul Kolar, of Indiana, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Seventh Circuit, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That if cloture is invoked on the Sherriff nomination, all time be considered expired and the confirmation vote occur at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Republican Leader.

*Ordered further*, That following the cloture vote on the Sherriff nomination, the Senate resume consideration of the Kolar nomination and the cloture motion ripen at 1:45 p.m.
