## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

*Ordered further,* That if cloture is invoked on the nomination, all time be considered expired at 3:45 p.m.

*Ordered further,* That if any nominations are confirmed during Wednesday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Sep. 23, 24, 2024.*)
