#### UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Robert F. Kennedy, Jr. (Cal. No. 17) (PN11-8) Howard Lutnick (Cal. No. 19) (PN11-9) Brooke Rollins (Cal. No. 16) (PN11-12) Kelly Loeffler (Cal. No. 20) (PN11-18)

*Ordered*, That following the conclusion of morning business on Thursday, February 13, 2025, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Robert F. Kennedy, Jr., of California, to be Secretary of Health and Human Services.

 $Ordered\ further,$  That at 10:30 a.m., notwith standing Rule XXII, all post-cloture time with respect to the Kennedy nomination expire.

Ordered further, That following disposition of the Kennedy nomination, the cloture motion with respect to the nomination of Brooke Rollins, of Texas, to be Secretary of Agriculture be withdrawn and the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination with no intervening action or debate.

Ordered further, That following disposition of the Rollins nomination, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of Howard Lutnick, of New York, to be Secretary of Commerce.

Ordered further, That at 1:45 p.m., the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the Lutnick nomination.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the Lutnick nomination, all time be considered expired and the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Kelly Loeffler, of Georgia, to be Administrator of the Small Business Administration.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the Loeffler nomination, all post-cloture time be expired, and the Senate vote on confirmation of the Loeffler and Lutnick nominations at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader no earlier than Tuesday, February 18, 2025.

Ordered further, That if any nominations are confirmed during Thursday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (Feb. 12, 2025.)


