UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Troy Edgar (Cal. No. 25) (PN12-14)
Lori Chavez-DeRemer (Cal. No. 29) (PN11-4)

Ordered, That following the conclusion of morning business on Thursday, March 6, 2025, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Troy Edgar, of California, to be Deputy Secretary of Homeland Security.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the Edgar nomination, all time be considered expired at 1:45 p.m. and the Senate vote on confirmation.

Ordered further, That following the confirmation vote on the Edgar nomination, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of Lori Chavez-DeRemer, of Oregon, to be Secretary of Labor, and vote on the motion to invoke cloture.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the Chavez-DeRemer nomination, all time be considered expired and the Senate vote on the nomination at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader on Monday, March 10, 2025.

Ordered further, That following the cloture vote on the Chavez-DeRemer nomination, the Senate proceed to legislative session.

Ordered further, That if any nominations are confirmed during Thursday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Mar. 5, 2025.*)
