*Ordered further*, That if cloture is invoked on the Topping nomination, all post-cloture time be expired at 1:45 p.m. and the Senate vote on confirmation.

*Ordered further*, That if the Lohmeier or Topping nominations are confirmed, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

Bove III, of Pennsylvania, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Third Circuit, all post-cloture time be expired and the Senate vote on confirmation at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader no earlier than Monday, July 28, 2025. When a notice of intent to object is given to the appropriate leader, or their designee, and such notice is submitted for inclusion in the Congressional Record and the Senate Executive Calendar, or following the objection to a unanimous consent to proceeding to, and, or disposition of, matters relating to nominations and treaties on their behalf, it shall be placed in the section of the Senate Executive Calendar entitled "Notice of Intent to Object". (S. Res. 28, 112<sup>th</sup> Congress)
