Ordered, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Wednesday, December 3, 2025, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Matthew E. Orso, of North Carolina, to be United States District Judge for the Western District of North Carolina.

Ordered further, That at 11:15 a.m., notwithstanding Rule XXII, the cloture motions on the Orso nomination and the nomination of Susan Courtwright Rodriguez, of North Carolina, to be United States District Judge for the Western District of North Carolina ripen.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the Orso nomination, the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination at 2:15 p.m.

Ordered further, That if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

Ordered further, That following disposition of the Orso nomination, the Senate resume legislative session and be in period of morning business.

Ordered further, That following the vote on the motion to proceed to S.J. Res. 91, the Senate resume executive session to consider the Rodriguez nomination.

Ordered further, That at 4:30 p.m., the Senate vote on the motion to invoke on the Rodriguez nomination.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the Rodriguez nomination, the post-cloture time be expired and the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader on Thursday, December 4, 2025, notwithstanding Rule XXII.
