Ordered, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Tuesday, January 6, 2026, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Joshua Simmons, of Virginia, to be General Counsel of the Central Intelligence.

Ordered further, That at 11:30 a.m., all post-cloture time be expired and the Senate vote on confirmation of the Simmons nomination.

Ordered further, That following the disposition of the Simmons nomination, the Senate recess until 2:15 p.m. to allow for the weekly conference meetings.

Ordered further, That at 2:20 p.m., all post-cloture time be expired and the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination of Sara Bailey, of Texas, to be Director of National Drug Control Policy.

Ordered further, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader no earlier than January 5, 2026, all post-cloture time be expired and the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination of Alexander C. Van Hook, of Louisiana, to be United States District Judge for the Western District of Louisiana.
