Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the nomination of Nicholas Jon Ganjei, of Texas, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of Texas, the Senate vote on confirmation at 2:15 p.m., and the Senate recess following the cloture vote on the Ganjei nomination until 2:15 p.m. to allow for the weekly conference meetings.
