## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

**Kevin Warsh (Cal. No. 728) (PN855-2)**

**Kevin Warsh (Cal. No. 727) (PN855-1)**

*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Tuesday, May 12, 2026, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Kevin Warsh, of Florida, to be a Member of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System for a term of fourteen years from February 1, 2026, post-cloture.

*Ordered further*, That at 11:30 a.m., notwithstanding Rule XXII, the Senate vote on confirmation of the Warsh nomination.

*Ordered further*, That if any nominations are confirmed during Tuesday's session of the Senate, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions, and the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table.

*Ordered further*, That if cloture is invoked on the nomination of Kevin Warsh, of Florida, to be Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System for a term of four years, all time during Leader remarks, recess, and adjournment count post-cloture. (*May 11, 2026.*)
