Ordered, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Kathleen S. Lane, of Montana, to be United States District Judge for the District of Montana.

Ordered further, That at 11:15 a.m., notwithstanding Rule XXII, the post-cloture time with respect to the Lane nomination be expired and the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination.

Ordered further, That the cloture vote with respect to the nomination of Jeffrey M. Kuhlman, of Kansas, to be United States District Judge for the District of Kansas occur following disposition of the Lane nomination.

Ordered further, That following disposition of the cloture motion with respect to the Kuhlman nomination, the Senate recess for the weekly conference meetings until 2:15 p.m.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on the Kuhlman nomination, the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination at 2:15 p.m.

Ordered further, That if any nominations are confirmed, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*June 1, 2026.*)
