## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

**Matthew A. Schwartz (Cal. No. 776) (PN938-2)**

**Arthur Roberts Jones (Cal. No. 778) (PN930-3)**

*Ordered,* That upon the conclusion of morning business on Monday, July 13, 2026, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Matthew A. Schwartz, of New York, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Second Circuit, post-cloture.

*Ordered further,* That the post-cloture time be expired on the nomination of Arthur Roberts Jones, of Texas, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of Texas, and the Senate proceed to executive session and vote on confirmation of the nomination at 5:30 p.m.

*Ordered further,* That if the Jones nomination is confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further,* That at 12 noon on Tuesday, July 14, 2026, notwithstanding Rule XXII, the post-cloture time with respect to the Schwartz nomination be expired.

*Ordered further,* That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader on Tuesday, July 14, 2026, the Senate vote on confirmation of the Schwartz nomination.

*Ordered further,* That if the Schwartz nomination is confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further,* That notwithstanding Rule XXII, the cloture motion with respect to S. 4784 ripen following disposition of the Schwartz nomination. (*June 24, 2026.*)
