

President Reagan vetoed seventy-eight bills, of which thirty-nine were regular vetoes and thirty-nine were pocket vetoes. Nine were overridden (Item Nos. 2400, 2402, 2412, 2415, 2434, 2444, 2453, 2454, and 2455).

**2394 H.R. 4353.**

To amend the Federal Bankruptcies Act of 1978.

Pocket veto occurred after the 1st session of the 97th Congress adjourned sine die on December 16, 1981. The bill was presented to the President on December 18, 1981. (127 Cong. Rec. 31893) A Presidential message was received by Congress on January 6, 1982. (127 Cong. Rec. 31894).

*Note*—This veto was the subject of a court case brought by a private corporation which raised the constitutionality of a pocket veto between sessions of the 97th Congress. The case did not result in any reported decision (Fidelity Mortgage Investors, No. 75-B-154 (Bkrcty. S.D.N.Y.) and Lifetime Communities Inc. v. Administrative Office of U.S. Courts, No. 81-Civ.-0544 (KTD) (S.D.N.Y.)).

2398 H.R. 5118.

To provide water and settle water rights to the Papago Tribe of Arizona.

*Vetoed on June 1, 1982.* The veto message was laid before the House, referred to the Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs, and printed as H. Doc. 97-191. (128 Cong. Rec. 12736, 13352).

*Veto unchallenged.*

2399 H.R. 5922.

Makes urgent supplemental appropriations and rescinds certain budget authority for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1982.

*Vetoed on June 24, 1982.* The veto message was laid before the House and printed as H. Doc. 97-204. (128 Cong. Rec. 15156).

*The House sustained the veto on June 24, 1982 by a vote of 253 yeas to 151 nays.* (128 Cong. Rec. 15167).

*Veto sustained.*

**2400 H.R. 6198.**

To amend the manufacturing clause of the Copyright Law.

*Vetoed on July 8, 1982.* The veto message was laid before the House and printed as H. Doc. 97-208. (128 Cong. Rec. 15772).

*The House overrode* the veto on July 13, 1982 by a vote of 324 yeas to 86 nays. (128 Cong. Rec. 16018).

*The Senate overrode* the veto on July 13, 1982 by a vote of 84 yeas to 9 nays. (128 Cong. Rec. 15946).

*Veto overridden.* (96 Stat. 178; Public Law 97-215).

**2401 H.R. 6682.**

Urgent supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1982.

*Vetoed on June 25, 1982.* The veto message was laid before the House and printed as H. Doc. 97-205. (128 Cong. Rec. 15284).

*The House sustained* the veto on July 13, 1982, by a vote of 242 yeas to 169 nays. (128 Cong. Rec. 15167).

*Veto sustained.*

**2402 H.R. 6863.**

Supplemental appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1982.

2412 H.R. 1062.

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to convey certain lands in Lane County, Oregon.

*Vetoed on October 19, 1983.* The veto message was laid before the House and printed as H. Doc. 98-124. (129 Cong. Rec. 28618).

*The House overrode the veto on October 25, 1983 by a vote of 297 yeas to 125 nays.* (129 Cong. Rec. 29196).

2413 H.R. 3564.

Requires the Secretary of Agriculture to announce earlier 1984 crop feed grain program and 1985 wheat and feed grain program.

*Vetoed on August 12, 1983.* The veto message was laid before the House, referred to the House Committee on Agriculture, and printed as H. Doc. 98-95. (129 Cong. Rec. 23701, 24776).

Pocket Vetoes

2414 H.R. 4042.

To continue in effect the current certification requirements with respect to El Salvador.

Pocket veto occurred after the 1st session of the 98th Congress adjourned sine die on November 18, 1983. The bill was presented to the President on November 18, 1983. (129 Cong. Rec. 34225).

*Note*—This veto was the subject of *Barnes v. Carmen* (582 F. Supp. 163 (D.D.C. 1984)). The district court upheld the President's veto citing the Supreme Court's Pocket Veto Case (Item No. 1058). This ruling was overturned upon appeal in *Barnes v. Kline* (759 F.2d 21 (D.C. Cir. 1985)). Since Congress had appointed officials to receive messages, the court concluded that the use of the pocket veto was unconstitutional. Upon appeal, the Supreme Court ruled that the issue was moot since the provisions of H.R. 4042 had no effect after Sept. 30, 1984 (*Burke v. Barnes*, 479 U.S. 361 (1978)). The bill was neither signed, nor returned, nor promulgated into law. It is counted here as a pocket veto and also in Table 1, p. ix, *supra*.

*The House overrode the veto on February 3, 1987 by a vote of 401 yeas to 26 nays.* (133 Cong. Rec. 2516).

To enhance the competitiveness of American industry.

*Vetoed on May 24, 1988.* The veto message was laid before the House and printed as H. Doc. 100-200. (134 Cong. Rec. 12130).

*The House overrode the veto on May 24, 1988 by a vote of 308 yeas to 113 nays. (134 Cong. Rec. 12152).*

*The Senate sustained the veto on June 8, 1988 by a vote of 61 yeas to 37 nays. (134 Cong. Rec. 13716).*

2458 H.R. 1154.

To remedy injury to the United States textile and apparel industries caused by increased imports.

*Vetoed on September 28, 1988.* The veto message was laid before the House and printed as H. Doc. 100-235. (134 Cong. Rec. 26415).

*The House sustained* the veto on October 4, 1988 by a vote of 272 yeas to 152 nays. (134 Cong. Rec. 28164).

To amend the Small Business Investment Act of 1958 to permit prepayment of loans made to state and local development companies.

A Presidential message dated October 31, 1988 was received by Congress. (1988 H. Jour., 2579; see also 24 Weekly Comp. of Pres. Doc. 1407, November 7, 1988).

2461 S. 508.

To amend Title 5, United States Code, to strengthen the protections available to Federal employees against prohibited personnel practices.

Pocket veto occurred after the 2d session of the 100th Congress adjourned sine die on October 22, 1988. The bill was presented to the President on October 14, 1988. (134 Cong. Rec. 30867). A Presidential message dated October 26, 1988 was received by Congress. (1988 H. Jour., 2578; see also 24 Weekly Comp. of Pres. Doc. 1377, October 31, 1988).

2462 S. 1081.

To establish a coordinated National Nutrition Monitoring and Related Research program, and a comprehensive plan for the assessment of the nutritional and dietary status of the United States population and the nutritional quality of the United States food

supply, with provision for the conduct of scientific research and development.

Pocket veto occurred after the 2d session of the 100th Congress adjourned sine die on October 22, 1988. The bill was presented to the President on October 27, 1988. (134 Cong. Rec. 32681). A Presidential message dated November 8, 1988 was received by Congress. (1988 H. Jour., 2579; *see also* 24 Weekly Comp. of Pres. Doc. 1474, November 14, 1988).

**2463 S. 2751.**

To designate certain lands in Montana as wilderness, to release other forest lands for multiple use management.

Pocket veto occurred after the 2d session of the 100th Congress adjourned sine die on October 22, 1988. The bill was presented to the President on October 22, 1988. (134 Cong. Rec. 32681). A Presidential message dated November 2, 1988 was received by Congress. (1988 H. Jour., 2579; *see also* 24 Weekly Comp. of Pres. Doc. 1427, November 7, 1988).

**2464 H.R. 2596.**

To improve Federal management of lands on Admiralty Island, Alaska.

Pocket veto occurred after the 2d session of the 100th Congress adjourned sine die on October 22, 1988. The bill was presented to the President on October 11, 1988. (134 Cong. Rec. 30597). A Presidential message was not received by the Congress and no written explanation for the veto was given. (*See* 1988 H. Jour., 2579).

**2465 H.R. 3621.**

To declare that certain lands located in California and held by the Secretary of the Interior are lands held in trust for the benefit of certain bands of Indians and to declare such lands to be part of the reservation with which they are contiguous.

Pocket veto occurred after the 2d session of the 100th Congress adjourned sine die on October 22, 1988. The bill was presented to the President on October 21, 1988. (134 Cong. Rec. 33322). A Presidential message dated November 1, 1988, was received by Congress. (1988 H. Jour., 2576; *see also* 24 Weekly Comp. of Pres. Doc. 1426, November 7, 1988). **2466 H.R. 3966.**

To require the Federal Communications Commission to reinstate restrictions on advertising during chil-

dren's television, to enforce the obligation of broadcasters to meet the educational and informational needs of the child audience.

Pocket veto occurred after the 2d session of the 100th Congress adjourned sine die on October 22, 1988. The bill was presented to the President on October 25, 1988. (134 Cong. Rec. 33328). **2467 H.R. 4432.**

To amend Title 13, United States Code, to require certain detailed tabulations relating to Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the decennial censuses of population.

To amend the Public Health Service Act to revise and extend the programs of nurse education established in Title VIII of such Act.

To amend section 207 of Title 18, United States Code, relating to restrictions on post-employment activities.

Pocket veto occurred after the 2d session of the 100th Congress adjourned sine die on October 22, 1988. The bill was presented to the President on November 11, 1988. (134 Cong. Rec. 33329). A Presidential message dated November 23, 1988, was received by Congress. (1988 H. Jour., 2577; *see also* 24 Weekly Comp. of Pres. Doc. 1561, November 28, 1988).

**2470 H.R. 5560.**

To amend the Public Health Service Act, and the Health Omnibus Programs Extension of 1988, to

make technical corrections relating to Health Omnibus Programs Extension of 1988.

Pocket veto occurred after the 2d session of the 100th Congress adjourned sine die on October 22, 1988. The bill was presented to the President on November 11, 1988. (134 Cong. Rec. 33330). A Presidential message dated November 23, 1988 was received by Congress. (1988 H. Jour., 2578; *see also* 24 Weekly Comp. of Pres. Doc. 1564, November 28, 1988).
