UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Paula Xinis (Cal. No. 307)

Ordered, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Paula Xinis, of Maryland, to be United States District Judge for the District of Maryland.

Ordered further, That there be 60 minutes for debate only on the nomination equally divided in the usual form; that upon the use or yielding back of time the Senate vote on the nomination without intervening action or debate, that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session without any intervening action or debate. When a notice of intent to object is given to the appropriate leader, or their designee, and such notice is submitted for inclusion in the Congressional Record and the Senate Executive Calendar, or following the objection to a unanimous consent to proceeding to, and, or disposition of, matters relating to nominations and treaties on their behalf, it shall be placed in the section of the Senate Executive Calendar entitled "Notice of Intent to Object". (S. Res. 28, 112th Congress)
