## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

### **Carlos G. Muniz (Cal. No. 376)**

*Ordered,* That following Leader remarks on Tuesday, April 17, 2018, the Senate proceed to executive session for the consideration of the nomination of Carlos G. Muniz, of Florida, to be General Counsel, Department of Education, with the time until 12:30 p.m. equally divided between the two Leaders or their designees.
